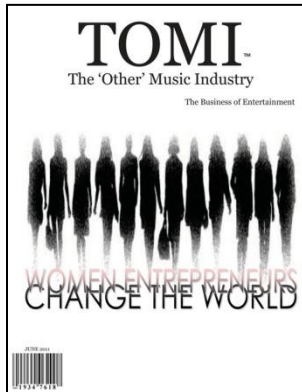


# WOMEN ENTREPRENEURS CHANGE THE WORLD
